Course structure

The course comprises two modules and is delivered in a blended learning format, combining self-paced online learning with in-person practical sessions and expertled teaching. Module I (20 credits/200 hours of study) Key principles in Small Animal Soft Tissue Surgery

This module contains seven units, five of which are supported by in-person practical sessions at our central London venue, covering the following topics:

- Soft Tissue Surgical Essentials
- Wound Management and Surgical Oncology
- Abdominal and Gastrointestinal Surgery
- Urogenital and Perineal Surgery
- Head, Neck and Thoracic Surgery

You'll complete a final summative assessment at the end of Module I, which includes case-based MCQs testing core knowledge and its practical application.

Module II (40 credits/400 hours of study) Case study portfolio

You'll need to submit four reflective case studies, showcasing a range of clinical topics/organ systems and demonstrating a logical approach to cases. Clinical mentorship evenings will be available for you to book to discuss your case studies and gain feedback.

The pass mark is 50%, with scores rounded to the nearest whole number.

Course delivery

Eligibility

- Applicants must hold a veterinary qualification (i.e. BVM&S, BVetMed, BVSc, BVMSci, VetMB)
- Applicants must be registered as a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (MRCVS)

150-130

- Applicants must have spent a minimum of one year in veterinary practice and should have completed the RCVS Professional Development Phase of Veterinary Graduate Development Programme (veterinary surgeons graduating before 2007 are exempt)
- Applicants must be currently practicing veterinary surgeons, as the course involves case-based learning that requires access to clinical cases
- As the course is taught and assessed in English, applicants are required to be proficient in the English language (6.5 minimum 5.5 in each individual element)
